Cleaning up Behind Charley:  
Town of Carolina Beach to Pickup  
Vegetative Debris from Curbsides  
Construction and Demolition Debris and White Goods Must be taken to Operations Garage

CAROLINA BEACH, NC---- The Town of Carolina Beach notifies all residents that curbside hurricane debris removal will begin on Wednesday, August 18, 2004. Residents are asked to pile vegetative debris only neatly by the curbside, away from the street, drainage ditches, fire hydrants, mailboxes and parked cars. Vegetative debris is considered things like grass, leaves, tree branches, etc. Please do not place the debris into garbage bags.

**Residents must bring any construction and demolition debris to the Operations Garage on 304 Dow Road.** No hazardous materials, gasoline, paint, petroleum products, household hazardous wastes will be accepted. White goods, (refrigerators, stoves, A/C units, etc.) must also be hauled to the Operations Garage.

Construction and demolition debris and white goods will be accepted at the Operations Garage from August 21, 2004 until August 29, 2004, Monday through Friday 8 a.m. – 9 p.m.; Saturdays 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. and Sundays 12 noon – 6 p.m. Residents should also call to report incidents of property damage. If anyone witnesses illegal dumping of vegetative or construction material, they are to notify the Carolina Beach Police Department.
