COUNCIL URGES CITIZENS TO HELP SAVE CAROLINA BEACH INLET

CAROLINA BEACH, NC --- Mayor Dennis Barbour and the Carolina Beach Town Council are urging Carolina Beach citizens – and anyone else who cares about the future of Carolina Beach – to write letters or send emails to all of our elected officials about reinstating federal funds for Carolina Beach inlet. People can go to the Town of Carolina Beach website at www.carolinabeach.org and click on the “**Please Save Our Inlet**” link at the top of the first page. Addresses, phone numbers, email and other pertinent information on all legislators and involved chairmen is available at this website. There is also a sample letter to legislators. People who do not have internet access can stop by Town Hall and staff will provide the information to them.

However, it is equally important for citizens to talk to relatives and friends from other states so they can contact their legislators and encourage them to support the efforts for Carolina Beach inlet as well.

“Our elected officials are fighting as hard as they can,” said Mayor Barbour, “but they will need help from other legislators around the country in order to enact the needed changes. We are going to have to reach out to people beyond our state borders.”

Currently, there are no federal funds dedicated for the maintenance of Carolina Beach inlet. Closing of the Carolina Beach inlet would have a devastating impact on the local economy especially in terms of commercial fishing and recreational boating. This would mean less business for all of the hotels, motels, stores, restaurants and other businesses that serve tourists and fishermen who come to this area.
